MEETING OF THE MORTH CAROLINA STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL ENAMINERS MOREHEAD CITY, NORTH CAROLINA -- JULY 11, 1936.

The minutes of the June meeting were read. There was a motion by Dr. Royal, which was seconded by Dr. McMillan that the minutes be approved. This motion was carried. After the motion had been passed, there was some discussion to the effect that a portion of the minutes relating to the appearance of Dr. Carl V. Reynolds before our last Board meeting did not convey an exactly correct interpretation of the feelings of the entire Board. After a rather free discussion by various members of the Board as to the wisdom or lack of wisdom of attempting to license County Health Officers between meetings; Dr. Griffith speaking from the chair made the following motion which was adopted by umanimous approval, "While the Board of Examiners does not, and has not changed any of its rules and regulations as regards to licensing of candidates at other than stated intervals or regular meetings, we do assure Dr. Reynolds of our desire to cooperate with him in the advancement of public health in the State."

At this point Dr. McMillan read a letter from an acquaintance of his in Baltimore giving information regarding the past record of Dr. William B. Dalton whose application was postponed at our June meeting. Upon the strength of this information and upon other information it was the concensus of opinion that since Dr. Dalton was not present that action upon his application be deferred indefinitely. The letter was signed by Dr. Kloman for the benefit of the Board and was filed with the application of Dr. Dalton.

At this point Dr. Griffith reported on the case of Dr. Lumpkin who had appeared before us at the June meeting and who failed to present his diploma. Dr. Griffith then stated that Dr. Roland Dean of the University of Maryland had written him certifying that Dr. Lumpkin was a full fledged graduate of the University of Maryland, and upon this information Dr. Griffith made a motion which was seconded by Drs. McKay and Royal to the effect "That we do hereby grant Dr. Lloyd Uber Lumpkin a license to practice medicine and surgery on his credentials as presented.

At this point the Secretary presented the case of Dr. H. Germer, Dake Station, 4197, who was born in Germany in 1904. He received his M. D. degree at Duke in 1936, not yet naturalized but who had taken out his first papers. He expects to go into Health Work in this State. Dr. Lawrence asked for instructions. At this point Dr. Smith reminded the Board that it was their policy not to license any individual who was not American born or a naturalized citizen. Therefore, Dr. H. Germer could not properly come before the Board at the present time.

At this point the Secretary read a rather long communication from Mr. Will Wood, Acting Commissioner of the Narcotic Eureau in Washington, D. C. The communication dealt with the case of Dr. Alton B. Freeman of Randleman; Dr. John Smythington of Carthage; Dr. Edward V. Barbeck of Weaverville, North Carolina. After considerable discussion of these cases there was a motion by Dr. Royal, seconded by Dr. Smith to the effect "That the letter from the Honorable Will Wood, Acting Commissioner be received and that the Secretary write the Commissioner and thank him for this communication. The motion was carried. It appeared to be the concensus of opinion that since two of these gentlemen had been fined, and that the Court had not seen fit to sentence them to imprisonment, there appeared to be little that we could other than a gentlemerprimand. In the case of Dr. Marbeck who had been sent to prison there was nothing we could do until Dr. Marbeck returned to the State at which time he would come under our jurisdiction. The Secretary reminded the Board that according to an impression gained from the former Attorney General that it would be unwise for us to attempt to reach one of these addicts while such addict was out of the State.

At this point the Secretary presented Dr. Carlton Noble Adams of Wilson Wills who was asking for a North Carolina license upon the strength of his Maryland credentials. After the veribal examination of the candidate the Board granted him a license in this State.

There was a motion by the Secretary to the effect "That the expenditures to date and as presented at our June meeting and today be authorized and approved as recorded by the Secretary. The motion was carried.

There was a motion by the Secretary which was seconded by Dr. McMillan to the effect "That 63 candidates who took our Senior portion of the examination had successfully passed the examination making a grade of 80, and that only one candidate, namely; (Dr. Gay who made 75) had failed. The motion therefore was that 63 whose names were presented be given a license to practice medicine and surgery in North Carolina which motion was carried. They were as follows:

There was a careful study made of the case of Dr. Gay whose average was below the minimum standard. After much discussion and careful consideration, therewas a motion by Dr. Royal which was seconded by Dr. Smith "That we defer action for the time being on Dr. Gay's case and that the Secretary be instructed to notify Dr. Gay to the effect that he may appear before the Board again at its December meeting if he so desires, or if he prefers he may wait until the June meeting in 1937 at which time he may reappear". This motion was carried.

There was a motion by Dr. Royal to the effect that President Griffith appoint a committee of two to confer with the three Medical Deans of this State and call their attention to the fact that the men taking the examination this year were not as good as usual. This motion was carried. Six members voted in the affirmative, the Secretary voted no. The President then appointed Dr. Smith and Dr. Lawrence on this committee. Dr. Smith asked to be relieved so Dr. Griffith named Dr. McKay in his place. The Committee stands Dr. Lawrence and Dr. McKay.

A motion by Dr. Smith and seconded by Dr. McKay that the Secretary be instructed to express to Mrs. K. G. Averitt the sympathy of the Board upon the death of her son. This motion was carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
