Minutes of the Open Sessions of the North Carolina Medical Board Meeting September 17-19, 2003.

The September 17-19, 2003, meeting of the North Carolina Medical Board was held at the Board's Office, 1203 Front Street, Raleigh, NC 27609. MISCELLANEOUS

Presidential Remarks

Dr. Garrett commenced the meeting by reading from Governor Easley's Executive Order No. 1, the "ethics awareness and conflict of interest reminder." No conflicts were reported.

Mr Gupta gave a preliminary presentation regarding this afternoon's Open House/Building Dedication Ceremony.

Dr. Garrett presented an engraved gavel for use by the Board dedicated by him and Mrs. Garrett.

Clinical Skills Examination - Reports From Dr. Moffatt and Dr. Fretwell

Dr. Moffatt and Dr. Fretwell attended separate USMLE Clinical Skills Examination (CSE) Learning Labs at the National Board of Medical Examiners (NBME) in Philadelphia. They made the following oral reports to the Board:

Dr. Moffatt reported that the workshop was from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The morning consisted of a review of the Step 1, 2, and 3 examinations, which he felt was unnecessary since he was there for the CSE. In the afternoon the group went to the ECFMG building and viewed the physical setup for the CSE as well as examinations in progress. This consisted of 12 examination rooms with pseudo patients. The pseudo patients are trained, however during the examination they have some flexibility in their answers to the medical student's questions. The examinee has 15 minutes to do a complete medical history consistent with the patient's symptoms. Then they leave the room and have 10 minutes to write up their diagnosis, etc. Dr. Moffatt was interested in the abdominal examination. No pelvic, rectal or breast examination was permitted. He stated that if he had attempted to do a physical on this type of patient without a pelvic or rectal exam he would have been kicked out of medical school. He feels that this part of the exam process is grossly inadequate. He does not think the Clinical Skills Examination is a very satisfactory method to measure the student's abilities in this area. This type of examination is better suited for the medical school arena under a proctor. He stated that during the workshop there was very little time to ask any questions. There will be only five examination sites across the United States. He did ask what the total cost would be to the medical student. He was given an example of a medical student going from New York to the Philadelphia exam site with the student taking a one-day roundtrip train ride. The cost to this student would be about \$1400 total, which includes the cost of the examination. The problem with this is that most of the students will not be attending medical schools that close to an exam site. He feels the majority will have to go by air and stay over for at least one night with the resulting costs associated with a plane ticket, hotel, food, etc.

Dr. Fretwell noted that the cost perspective may be a heavy load for individuals. In terms of presentation, from his observation as a layperson, the NBME was trying hard to do a good sell. (All of this is based on his August 25 visit.) He feels that the program could be improved by more candid discussions among interested Board Members. He suggested that, at some future time, we would need to find out if a medical student who passes this test actually does do better in his clinical practice. He asked whether at some time the exam could be expanded to involve pediatrics and older/frail patients. He went on to say that it will be interesting to see what changes are made after the program is running for a while. To him, the tests seemed objective and fair and have undergone appropriate scrutiny by test experts. The test may be imperfect at this point but he feels that already it may be having a positive influence on medical schools regarding their requirements for hands-on clinical training.

He was advised that the test was administered "on a trial run basis" to medical students in the Philadelphia area at the appropriate level of training. The students at School X all passed except for 2 percent. The failure rate of School Y, however, was 20 percent.

Dr. Fretwell believes that one of the results of requiring the exam would be more effective listening by physicians and establishing quicker and more effective two-way communication with the patient.

Dr. Pories expressed his concerns about the CSE examinations with the following reasons:

- He doubted that failure to conduct a workup was a major problem in today's practice of medicine. He added that in his six years on the Board, he had still not encountered a case

where a physician required disciplining because of his or her inability to take a history or conduct a physical examination.

- The test is not realistic
 - The brief time allotted, 15 minutes, is not an adequate time to conduct a patient workup.
 - If we are trying to get physicians to be better listeners and more caring, this test, with its brief time and superficiality, teaches the opposite.
 - The test does not include the two most difficult aspects of a physical examination: the rectal and pelvic exams
 - The test does not include examination of infants, children, adolescents, and the elderly, each with their own special needs.
- The test is expensive for students already laboring under exhausting debts in the tens of thousands of dollars. The cost of the test is not the only expense. To it must be added the costs of travel, an overnight stay, food, and, often, baby-sitting expenses as well. Our students judge the total cost to be \$1,600, not an insignificant amount, to be tested for a subject that should already be included in the tuition.
- A failure rate of 20% in a test administered by the folks who are pushing the program is not credible or meaningful.
- The most serious criticism, however, is that the test has not been validated in terms of its objectives. There is no evidence that physicians who have had this test are any better clinicians than those who have not had it. To institute a nation-wide expensive program without valid, really valid, pilot studies does not seem wise.

Dr. Pories, however, also agreed that it was "a done deal" and that resistance at this point would be fruitless. However, the program should be re-evaluated by the Federation within the next three to five years. It should not continue unless there is significant evidence that this approach is improving medical care.

Resolution in Recognition of Distinguished Service - John Tyler Dees, MD Motion: A motion was approved by acclamation to adopt the following resolution:

"WHEREAS, John Tyler Dees, MD, a graduate of the Duke University School of Medicine who did his internship at Watts Hospital in Durham and his residency at Duke Hospital, dedicated his life to a rural family practice in his native Burgaw, North Carolina;

WHEREAS, Dr Dees was a charter diplomate of the American Board of Family Physicians;

WHEREAS, he served as Pender County Health Director, chief of staff of Pender Memorial Hospital, and medical director of Huntington Health Care Center;

WHEREAS, he rendered dedicated service to the North Carolina Academy of Family Physicians, the American Academy of Family Physicians, the Southern Medical Association, the Wake and New Hanover-Pender County Medical Societies, the North Carolina Medical Society, and the American Medical Association;

WHEREAS, he served with distinction as president of the North Carolina Medical Society in 1991-92 and as a member of the Society's Executive Council;

WHEREAS, he served as a delegate to the American Medical Association's House of Delegates;

WHEREAS, he was a member of the North Carolina Medical Board from 1997 to 2003 and served on the Board's Complaints, Physicians Health Program, Investigative, Licensing, Clinical Pharmacist Practitioner, and Executive Committees, among others;

WHEREAS, he served with grace, skill, and effectiveness as the Board's secretary/treasurer (2000-2001), president elect (2001-2002), and president (2002-2003);

WHEREAS, his personal philosophy—"service to humanity is the best work of life"—guided his career and defined his life;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Carolina Medical Board publicly and with deep appreciation recognizes and honors the strong, effective, unselfish, and humane leadership of John Tyler Dees, MD, and expresses its debt to him for his service and dedication to those principles of professionalism, integrity, and public protection that must characterize the Board and its work; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a conference room in the North Carolina Medical Board's office building be named in honor of John Tyler Dees, MD, during the dedication of that building on September 17, 2003; and that a copy of this Resolution be on permanent display in the John Tyler Dees, MD, Conference Room, a copy be made a part of the minutes of the Board, and a copy be presented to Mrs Dees."

Dale Breaden, Communications Director, presented his report regarding *Forum*, website hits, media coverage, staff and Board presentations, etc.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

Charles Garrett, MD; Stephen Herring, MD; Robert Moffatt, MD; Arthur McCulloch, MD; Walter Pories, MD

The Executive Committee of the North Carolina Medical Board was called to order at 12:45 pm, Wednesday September 17, 2003 at the offices of the Board. Present were: Charles L. Garrett, MD, Chair; Stephen M. Herring, MD; Harlan A. McCulloch, MD; Robert C. Moffatt, MD and Walter J. Pories, MD. Aloysius P. Walsh was also in attendance. Members of the staff in attendance were R. David Henderson, (Executive Director), Hari Gupta (Director of Operations), and Peter T. Celentano, CPA (Comptroller).

Financials

Mr. Celentano, CPA, presented to the committee the July 2003 compiled financial statements. July 2003 is the end of the third quarter of fiscal year 2003.

Mr. Celentano explained to the Committee that the deficit for the month of July was \$2,975 and that the total deficit was not going to be any more than has been previously discussed. Total Revenue through the first nine months of fiscal year 2003 is 2% over the amount budgeted. Total Administrative Expenses are currently 2% over budget. Our current year to date deficit is \$211,710. Dr. Pories made a motion to accept the financial statements as reported. Dr. Moffatt seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

The July 2003 Investment Summary was reviewed and accepted as presented.

Old Business

Renovation update: Mr. Gupta gave an update on the building renovations. The renovation is complete except for paving the parking area and removing the breezeway. The project has been completed and the actual expenditures are less than 1% over the total budget for the project.

<u>Hilton Contract -2004 & 2005</u>: Mr. Celentano discussed with the Committee the contracts for 2004 and 2005 with the North Raleigh Hilton. A motion was made to sign the contract for 2004 and 2005 and lock in for two years the 3% increase in the room rates.

New Business

Sharing of NP Registration Fees: Mr. Celentano explained to the Committee the history of the 50% sharing of the Nurse Practitioner registration fee. Copies of the November 2001 Joint Subcommittee Meeting minutes were made available as well as the 2001Nurse Practitioner Joint Subcommittee Report. Mr. Henderson felt that it was important that we rely on the decision-making process that occurred in 2001 and felt it would be awkward to request a change at this time.

NCPHP Funding Calculation: Mr. Celentano displayed to the Committee a spreadsheet that showed the correct and incorrect (current) methods for calculating the amount to send to the NC Physicians Health Program on a monthly basis. This spreadsheet showed that the NC Medical Board had overpaid the NCPHP \$31,272. Mr. Henderson sent a memo dated September 5, 2003 to Dr. Michael Wilkerson, the Medical Director of the NCPHP and it was agreed that the surplus amount would be deducted from the September 2003 payment to the NCPHP.

Board Member/Committee requests of Staff: Mr. Gupta outlined a new proposed procedure to properly channel work to appropriate staff. This applies to any requests from individual Board Members or for requests from Committees. Mr. Gupta explained the difference between simple and complex tasks and the protocol for completing these types of tasks.

Dr. Garrett also communicated the importance of channeling all correspondence through the Executive Director.

<u>Fiscal Year 2004 Budget</u>: The proposed draft of the fiscal year 2004 was presented. Dr. Moffatt made a motion to tentatively approve the budget and to distribute the Budget to the entire Board for discussion and approval at the October 2003 Board meeting. The motion was seconded by Dr. Herring and approved unanimously.

Meeting with Auditors – Lynch & Howard, CPAs, PA: Mr. Woody Jackson, CPA, audit partner at Lynch & Howard, CPAs, came to discuss aspects of the audit that will take place at the end of the fiscal year. Mr. Jackson explained the various new fraud provisions that need to be implemented in order to complete the audit and answered questions related to the pending audit.

Before meeting with Mr. Jackson, Dr. Garrett and Mr. Henderson stated that they were hopeful the Board could negotiate a contract that lasts several years at a fee that the Committee felt was reasonable and if that was not possible the Board would consider putting the audit up to bid.

<u>Declaratory Ruling – NC Respiratory Care Board</u>: Mr. Thomas Mansfield, Director of the Legal Department, explained to the Committee that Dr. Joseph Coyle, Chair of the North Carolina Respiratory Care Board (NCRCB), shared with the Medical Board a draft of a declaratory ruling to be considered for adoption by the NCRCB in October. The declaratory ruling is intended to "interpret the applicability of NC General Statute 90-648 (10)(b) in regards to licensed Respiratory Care Practitioners (RCP's) providing conscious sedation to patients receiving Respiratory Care procedures in North Carolina Hospitals licensed pursuant to GS."

Mr. Mansfield answered various questions asked by the Committee and Dr. Moffatt made a motion to accept the information as presented. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

A motion passed to close the session to prevent the disclosure of information that is confidential pursuant to section 90-8, 90-14, 90-16, 90-21.22 and 143-318.11(a) of the North Carolina General Statutes and not considered a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes and to preserve attorney/client privilege.

Mr. Mansfield discussed legal matters regarding litigation with the Full Board in a closed session (no written materials were distributed).

A motion passed to return to open session.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:20 pm.
